# LEARNING TABLET LAYOUT

## POWER BUTTON ON/OFF

Turn ON - Press and hold the power button for about 5 seconds until you see the display turning On.  
Turn OFF - Press and hold the power button for about 2 seconds to display the shutdown dialog box, tap Power Off.

## VOLUME

- 1]. Press the Volume key (+) to louder, (-) to lower.
- 2]. Show a slider on display to adjust the volume level.



## TOUCH SCREEN PANEL

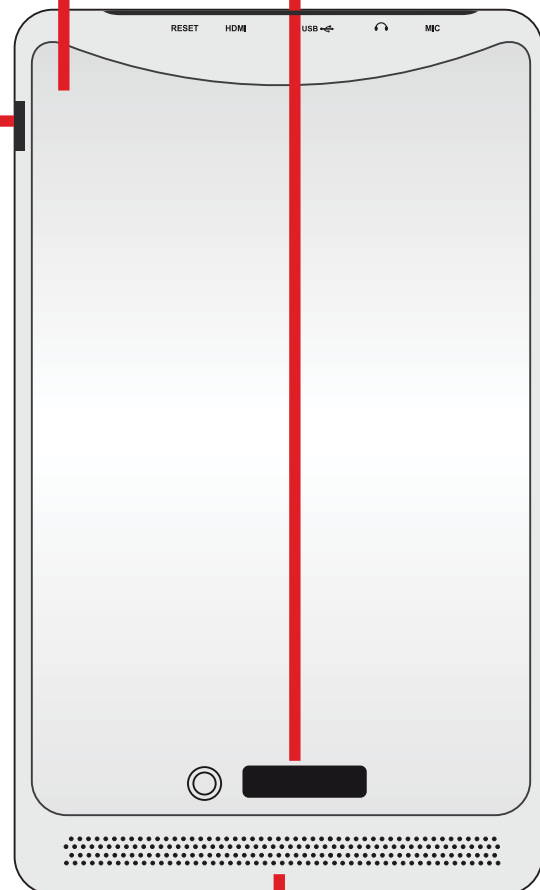

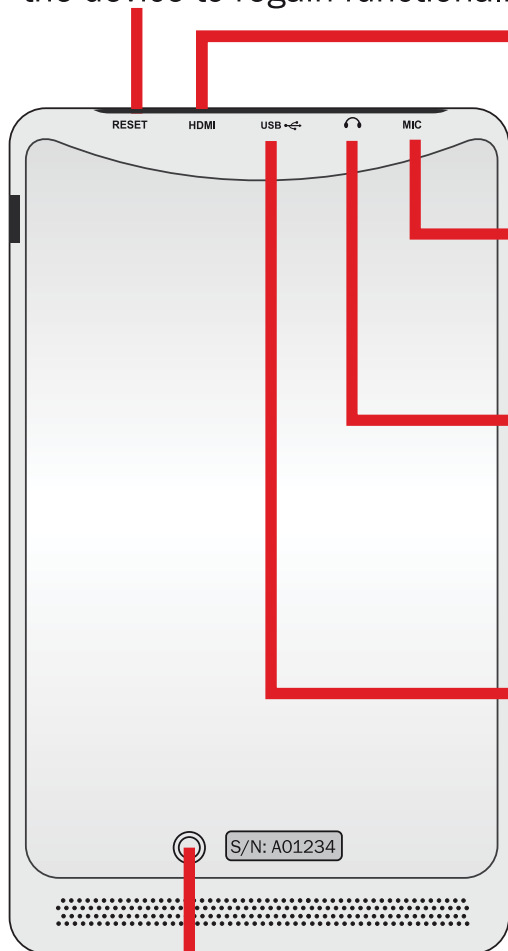


## AUDIO SPEAKER SYSTEM

## RESET --

If your device experiences fatal errors, hanging, or freezing, you may need to reset the device to regain functionality.



### HDMI Port

### HEADPHONE

The stereo combo jack (3.5mm) connects the Learning Tablet audio signal to headphones or amplified speakers. Using this jack automatically disables the built-in speaker.

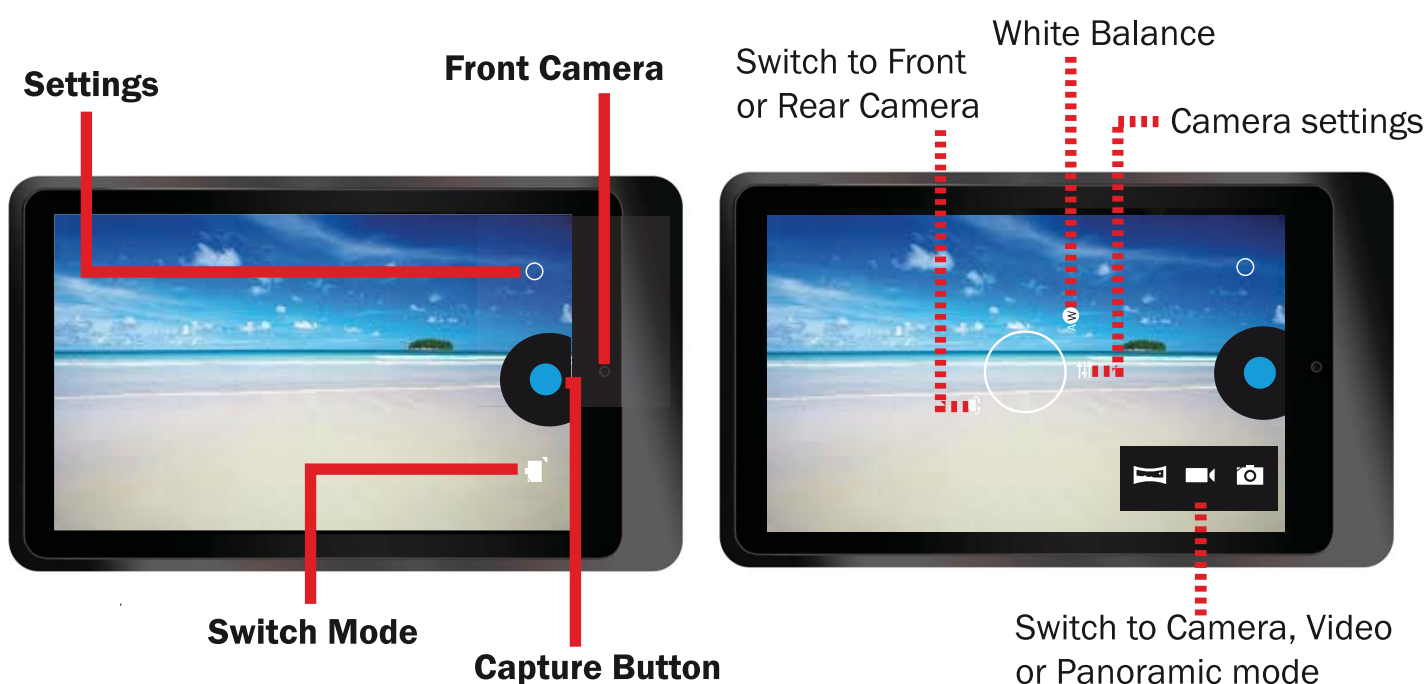

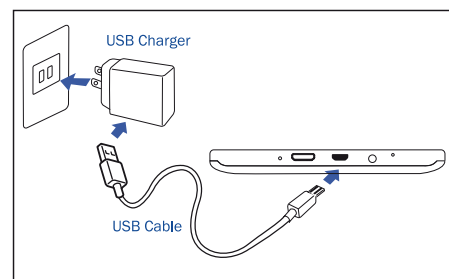
## CHARGE THE BATTERY

\*\* Before using the device for the first time or when the battery is low, you must charge the battery.

Fully charge the battery up to about 7 hours for first time use.

\*\* Use the USB Power adapter that comes with your device, connect your Learning Tablet to a power outlet.

The power plug of the adapter varies with your country of origin.



Input Voltage: 100V — 240VAC

Output Voltage: 5.0V, 2.0A


\*\* You cannot charge the Learning Tablet only with a USB cable. The computer or other power bank charger connecting with USB cable does not provide enough power to charge the tablet.

\*\* If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even while it is charging. Allow the battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

\*\* When the battery is low, the device will emit a warning tone and show a low battery message. Recharge the battery to continue using your tablet.

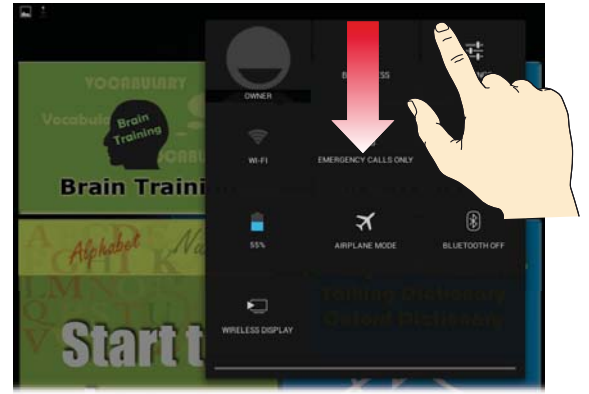
\*\* When you are not using your device, switch to Sleep Mode by pressing the Power key. This can help you to save battery power and can use the device longer between charges.

## SETTING THE DEVICE

There are several ways to enter the Settings screen, tap Settings Icon [  ] to display Settings Menu. Get more from your device by changing settings to match your preferences.

## QUICK SETTING PANEL

- Drag Down the notification area on the top right corner.  
The Quick Setting Panel will pop up on the right, tap the individual icons to turn On/Off the function.



### OWNER

- This feature is not for your model.

### BRIGHTNESS

- Adjust the brightness of the display

### SETTINGS

- Tap it to display Settings Menu

### Wi-Fi On/Off

- By default, your learning tablet activates the Wi-Fi feature.  
All the learning applications on the Language Learning screen does not need internet connection.
- You may tap on the Wi-Fi Icon to connect to a Wi-Fi AP and access the internet, to do other features required internet connection e.g. Browser, Youtube or Facebook etc.
- Please note: Turn on the Wi-Fi feature will consume more battery power.

### EMERGENCY CALLS ONLY

- This feature is not for your model.

### AUTO ROTATE

- By default, your learning tablet automatically changes its orientation from Landscape to Portrait mode and vice-versa depending on the way you hold your learning tablet.
- Please note: All the applications on Language Learning are designed with their orientation and they will not be changed even the auto-rotate function is activated.

### BATTERY STATUS

- View the amount of battery power consumed by your device.

### AIRPLANE MODE

- Activate AIRPLANE mode to disable all wireless functions on your device. You can use only non-network features.

### BLUETOOTH On/Off

- Activate the Bluetooth feature to exchange information over short distances.





	Acid Rain
General Statement	Acid rain is rain that is highly acidic because of sulphur oxides, nitrogen oxides, and other air pollutants dissolved in it. Normal rain is slightly acidic, with a pH of 6. Acid rain may have a pH value as low as 2.8. Acid rain can severely damage both plant and animal life. Certain lakes, for example, have lost all fish and plant life because of acid rain.
Explanation	Acid rain comes from sulphur in coal and oil. When they burn, they make sulphur dioxide (SO <sub>2</sub> ). Most sulphur leaves factory chimneys as the gaseous sulphur dioxide (SO <sub>2</sub> ) and most nitrogen is emitted as nitrogen oxides (NO or NO <sub>2</sub> ), both of which are gases. The gases may be dry deposited-absorbed directly by the land, by lakes or by the surface vegetation. If they are in the atmosphere for any time, the gases will oxidise (gain an oxygen atom) and go into solution as acids. Sulphuric acid (H <sub>2</sub> SO <sub>4</sub> ) and the nitrogen oxides will become nitric acid (HNO <sub>3</sub> ). The acids usually dissolve in cloud droplets and may travel great distances before being precipitated as acid rain. Catalysts such as hydrogen peroxide, ozone and ammonium help promote the formation of acids in clouds. More ammonium (NH <sub>4</sub> <sup>+</sup> ) can be formed when some of the acids are partially neutralised by airborne ammonia (NH <sub>3</sub> ). Acidification increases with the number of active hydrogen (H <sup>+</sup> ) ions dissolved in acid. Hydrocarbons emitted by for example, car exhausts will react in sunlight with nitrogen oxides to produce ozone. Although it is invaluable in the atmosphere, low level ozone causes respiratory problems and also hastens the formation of acid rain.

## **TROUBLESHOOTING**

### **1. Lock or unlock the touch screen when Power On the device**

#### **The touch screen responds slowly when Power On the device**

When you Power On the device, it takes about a minute to load the contents on the device.

Your device may lock the touch screen to prevent unintended operations.

If the loading has not been completed, the device may not respond if you unlock it.

You may press the Power key to activate the touch screen if you see the touch screen off.

### **2. The device has no respond while it is charging**

If the battery is completely discharged, you cannot turn on the device, even while it is charging. Allow a depleted battery to charge for a few minutes before you try to turn on the device.

### **3. Don't know if the device is on charging**

Press the Power Button, the screen displays a charging battery icon to indicate the device is on charging.

### **4. Don't know if the device is fully charged**

Press the Power Button, the screen displays a fully charge battery icon to indicate the device is fully charged or still on charging.

### **5. The device beeps and the battery icon is empty**

Your battery is low. Recharge the battery to continue using the device.

### **6. Your device is hot if touched**

When you use applications that require more power or use applications on your device for an extended period of time, your device may feel hot.

This is normal and should not affect your device's lifespan or performance.

### **7. The touch screen responds slowly**

Your device freezes or has fatal errors

If the touch screen responds slowly, you may need to close applications with the task manager or reset the device to regain functionality.

### **8. Data usage -- The data size is less than the specification**

The actual available capacity of the internal memory is less than the specified capacity because the operating system and default applications occupy part of the memory.

### **9. Accuracy of Voice Translator**

The Voice Recognition accuracy rate is about 70% to 80% in normal conditions.

Device vary widely in the ability to recognize voice due to noisy background or different accents. If you have met a small recognition missing or mistake, you may simply edit your voice text by tapping a keyboard on screen.

## **10. What's difference between the Voice Translator on Language Learning and the Voice Translator on Desk Top**

- \*\* The Voice Translator on Language Learning is an OFFLINE application, no internet connection needed. The Offline Recognition accuracy rate is about 70% in normal conditions.
- \*\* The Voice Translator on Desk Top is an ONLINE application, it need Wi-Fi or 3G/4G internet connection. The Online Recognition accuracy rate is about 80% in normal conditions.

## **11. Accuracy of Computer Text Translator (no internet needed)**

The Computer Text Translator is about 80% to 100% accuracy.

If the phrase you want to look up is not listed among the results, or the database does not include a phrase, then the computer will automatically generate a translation. Since the translation is generated by computer, the result should be used as reference rather than exact translation.

If only a single word is entered, the product will automatically transfer to the Dictionary interface.

## **12. Where to find an individual dictionary to look up, e.g. Oxford Dictionary of English**

All the dictionaries are built in the application of

[Talking Text Translator - Talking Dictionary]; or [Look up a Word].

If you want to look up an individual dictionary, you may find all the individual title of dictionary on Desk Top.

## **13. Whether the device need Wi-Fi or Internet connection**

It does not need internet connection if you don't use Browser, Youtube, Facebook, Wikipedia, Play Stores or other applications you download by yourself.

You need to activate Wi-Fi if you want to have Internet access for above similar features.

## **14. Whether the device can go internet or cannot go internet**

The device can go internet through Built-in Wi-Fi or connect with external 3G dongle.

The device is default to have internet connection.

If you want to give the device to kids and do not want them to access internet, you may input password to lock the feature of Internet Connection on your device.

When you want to have Internet Connection back, you may unlock the control.

The application of 'Internet Control' is placed on the 'All Application'.

## **15. How to use 3G connection because the device does not have built-in 3G function**

You may purchase an external 3G dongle in a telecommunication company of your city, plug in the 3G dongle to the device.

## **16. Whether all languages have Computer Text Translation**

Most of languages have this technology built in except some languages of Myanmar, Sinhala, Tajik, Kyrgyz, Uzbek or Turkmen etc.
